NEEDS

The CHO Food Closet needs dishwashing detergent (small bottles as we cannot divide the large ones), toilet paper, toothbrushes and toothpaste, tomato sauce and tuna fish. We can also use diapers, sizes 4 and 5. Please call the main CHO phone number, 703-281-7614, to make an appointment to drop off food and supplies.

The CHO Clothing Closet is in need of winter clothing for men, women and children. Winter jackets in all sizes are our greatest need. If any organizations are sponsoring extended clothing drives, we would appreciate it if you would consider delivering some of your contributions part way through the drive, as the need for clothes is most urgent this month. The Closet is open to receive deliveries at the VPC Condos on Park Street on Monday mornings, or you can make an appointment by calling the CHO clothes closet number, 703-679-8966, or emailing cho.clothes.closet@gmail.com. Because of space limits, we can only accept winter clothing at this time.

The CHO Furniture Program has an ongoing need for beds (all sizes except King), dressers and chests of drawers, sofas and love seats (but no sleep sofas or sectional sofas), dining table/chair sets, microwave ovens, rugs, lamps, baby cribs and mattresses. The Program also collects gently used and new bicycles for the Christmas Store. We do not need coffee tables and end tables, living room chairs, large cabinets, hutches, bookcases, entertainment centers, desks, or desk chairs. We can occasionally use large electric appliances (washers/dryers/refrigerators/stoves) if they are in good working condition. The Program is currently in need of additional help for its weekly pickups and deliveries. The Furniture Program warehouse, provided by the Town of Vienna, is located in the Northside Maintenance Yard on Mill Street in Vienna. The truck used by the Program was

NFCU 5K Run/Walk

The Navy Federal Credit Union (NFCU) 5K Run/Walk was held on Saturday morning, October 1. CHO Chair Ollie Fowler was introduced and described CHO's activities. Jean Reese, daughter of Peg Boag of our emergency services team, took third place in her age division. Congratulations! Other CHO volunteers and their families participated in the race. Many, many thanks to NFCU and its large numbers of volunteers who organize, publicize and run in the race. Proceeds from the race, plus a corporate donation from NFCU, significantly assist our work every year. Last year we received \$20,000 from NFCU.

CROP Walk

The Vienna Crop Walk, a fundraiser to fight hunger worldwide and locally, took place on Sunday, October 16. The activities began with a concert at Vienna Presbyterian Church, followed by the Walk through parts of Vienna, and ended back at VPC for refreshments and a silent auction. CHO will receive 25% of the proceeds of the 2016 Walk. CHO has received over \$8,000 annually in the past few years from the CROP Walk, and since the inception of the Walk in Vienna, CROP has provided over \$65,000 to CHO! Local businesses, including Vienna's Chipotle, Ledo Pizza, and Zoe's Kitchen, held special CROP days in which they donated a portion of their proceeds to raise additional funds. Other local businesses and organizations that supported CROP in various ways this year included CEXEC, Vienna Presbyterian Church and Presbyterian Women of VPC, Vienna Rotary Club, Evergreene Homes, Bueana Dillas, Merrifield Dental (J. Kim), Orthodontics by Crutchfield, Ronnie Elias Salon, Commonwealth Home Design, American Window Systems, Inc., and many others. Annual Committee Reports

The reports for each of the Committee for Helping Others (CHO) subcommittees for the July 2015 through June 2016 fiscal year follow. CHO's Annual Report is at the end of this Newsletter. The purpose of CHO is to provide charity to needy persons in the community. CHO's primary geographic area of charitable work includes Vienna, Oakton, Merrifield, and Dunn Loring, Virginia. The aid provided includes, but is not limited to:

EMERGENCY SERVICES: Supplies aid to individuals and families in meeting emergency rent, fuel, utility, dental, and medical bills and other miscellaneous aid.

 During the last fiscal year, 156 utility bills, 191 rent and mortgage bills, 23 medical bills, and 25 miscellaneous bills were paid, resulting in 453 bills paid totaling \$107,066.11.

FOOD CLOSET: Distributes food and food certificates primarily to persons and families requiring immediate assistance. In addition, Christmas food certificates are distributed.

 In this reporting period, 891 families (3,064 people) were helped, including those families helped as part of CHO's annual Christmas program.

FURNITURE: Provides pick up of donated furniture and distribution to families in need.

 During this reporting period, we distributed approximately \$11,400 worth of household furnishings and appliances in response to 88 requests.

CLOTHES CLOSET: Collects and distributes clothing to the needy.

 During the 2015 - 2016 fiscal year, the CHO Clothes Closet served 643 families (2,144 individuals). A conservative estimate is that we provided three tons of clothing to clients this season. Volunteers spent 433 hours serving clients. Note that estimates do not include clients served or hours volunteered outside of normal operational hours.

MEALS ON WHEELS: Provides meal deliveries from Vienna Presbyterian Church to persons having difficulty preparing their own food.

 During this reporting period, 5,789 meals were delivered. Deliveries were made for meals for six days a week, including Saturdays.

TRANSPORTATION: The CHO Transportation Program has been suspended. Ride requests are referred to the Shepherd's Center of Oakton-Vienna.



December 10 Christmas Program HELP Wanted!

The 2016 Christmas Program distribution day will be Saturday, December 10, at Vienna Presbyterian Church. We need volunteers on either or both program days -- Friday, December 9, starting at 9:30 a.m. to help set up and Saturday, December 10, starting at 8:30 a.m. to help take clients through the store. Please join us this year to help the less fortunate in our community.

DONATIONS: We are still looking for donations of food cards for adults, gift cards for teens, new toys for children ages 0 to 12, and new or like new jackets and coats. Please donate clothes as soon as possible so they can be sorted before the Christmas Store. Clothing donations can be dropped at the Clothes Closet any Monday morning or by appointment.

BIKES: We need volunteers to accept donations and to help clean and repair the donated bikes. Bikes can be dropped off between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. on Saturday November 12 and November 26, at both Vienna Presbyterian Church (Mill Street entrance) and Antioch Christian Church (1860 Beulah Road). They will be cleaned/repaired on Saturday, November 19 and December 3, at Antioch Christian Church. If you have questions about bike collections, please contact ediporter8@gmail.com.

John Kliewer, Former CHO Furniture Volunteer, Remembers the Furniture Program

John Kliewer, warmly remembered as an energetic volunteer for CHO's furniture program, died on September 22, 2016. In the process of collecting donated furniture and making deliveries, John drove several trucks - his own battered red GMC pickup, and later, surplus 20 and 22-foot box trucks supplied by Fairfax County. He collected, transported and carried untold numbers of mattresses, beds, sofas and washing machines up and down thousands of stairs. John received an outstanding Volunteer Award from the mayor of Vienna in 2006 for his work.

John described his work with CHO in an essay, "Days in the Life of the CHO Furniture Program." He mentions thinking that a Fairfax County caseworker's description of a family as one that "had nothing and were sleeping on the floor," was probably exaggerated, but "[o]n arrival, a couple of days later, we find that there is literally no furniture in their small apartment and that these two people are sleeping on shelving paper." He recounted one of his furniture colleagues saying that "it was amazing how the load suddenly became lighter as the beds, tables/chairs etc., were carried to their upstairs apartment." John also described the reaction of a different recipient, an elderly Vietnamese woman. "To [her], it was almost unbelievable that someone would be giving her these items with no strings attached."

John was a fair historian, and recounted frustrations and mistakes that inevitably occurred. He recalled delivering a washing machine that appeared to be in good condition, but which later leaked and soaked the upstairs carpet. "With apologies, we put [the recipient's] name at the top of the list for the next 'good' washing machine." In another instance he described a frantic and unsuccessful search for a lost telephone number the day after a donation of beds arrived - beds that might have helped a woman with a 2 year old daughter whom he had assisted a few days earlier. "I feel terrible," he wrote.

John concluded, however, that "[w]hile the CHO Furniture Program affords an array of different experiences, the service we provide is almost always to people in genuine need and genuinely appreciated. In many cases the situation is touching and poignant for those of us associated with the program. While we sometimes misjudge a situation or miss the target, we sometimes do it right and when we do, the feeling of satisfaction for being a part of the Committee for Helping Others and having helped someone in need, makes it all worthwhile."
