The Walk supports international and local hunger relief efforts, and CHO receives part of the proceeds.

## **Christmas Store**

Toys, clothes, and food & gift cards were distributed to the 104 families (503 family members) who came through the Christmas Store last December. Over 65 additional people, including those living on Social Security and disability, were helped as well, and over 90 bikes were collected, repaired, and distributed.

Thanks to Vienna Presbyterian Church for use of their space, to Antioch Christian Church and Bikes@Vienna for help with the bike drive, to the churches and others that collected gift cards during the year, and to those organizations that have contributed toys for many years. The photo at right shows our toy setup. Thanks to all volunteers, especially Social4good, who staffed a large portion of the Store.

We are already planning the next Christmas Store, on December 7. A gift card collection is already scheduled for September 21-22 after all Masses at Our Lady of Good Counsel in Vienna.

# EMERGENCY SERVICES VOLUNTEERS REACH OUT

Our Emergency Services team uses a number of resources to serve clients with difficulty communicating in English. A Cloudbreak Foundation grant helped us to provide information in Spanish and Arabic. We also use our email system's translation features.

In this effort, we rely on the unflagging and sympathetic help of our webmaster, Mike Croghan, who receives, translates, and sends messages to our volunteers and clients and who has become part of our emergency services team. When personal communication is needed, we rely on two caring volunteer translators, Becky Feltman and Shauna Abbassi. Without Mike, Becky and Shauna, relief for many of our clients would fall through the cracks.



#### **ACTIVITY REPORTS**

**FOOD CLOSET:** During the first three months of 2024, we helped 140 families (approximately 501 people) and gave out \$840 in food cards. Call 703-281-7614 box # 1 to arrange for food donations. Current needs are cereal, cooking oil, Velveeta cheese. Mac-N-Cheese, snack bars, & cookies.

**FURNITURE:** The Furniture Program, which collects and distributes gently used furniture, operates at the sheds on Mill Street on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday of the month. Over the first there months of 2024, about \$2000 of furniture has been distributed to over 20 clients. Needed items are beds, tables, and chairs.

**CLOTHES CLOSET**: The Clothes Closet, which collects and distributes clothing, operates on Mondays, 9:30 – noon. Call 703-679-8966 to make an appointment or to donate. About 78 individuals came to the Closet in the first three months of 2024, shopping for themselves and family members. Most needed items are men's and women's shorts, and men's jeans sizes 30, 32 and 34.

**EMERGENCY SERVICES**: Provides emergency rent, fuel, utility, dental, medical, and other emergency costs. Our main costs are rents; utility requests are also high. For the first three months of 2024, we provided \$56,529 in-area emergency aid, and \$1,214 out of area aid, to 125 in-area families and 26 out of area families.

#### SPOTLIGHT: VIENNA ROTARY CLUB

Founded in 1965, the Rotary Club of Vienna has sponsored events in Vienna and contributed to local, national, and global philanthropic activities. The Vienna Club has approximately 76 members. They include local business owners and professionals, Vienna's mayor, workers at local nonprofits, and retirees. CHO has received annual donations from the Club for many years. Vienna Rotary is part of the International Rotary, which has over 35,000 clubs. Rotary's charitable arm, the Rotary Foundation, has existed for over 100 years, and has spent over \$4 billion on life-changing projects.

Vienna Rotary's defining event for many is <u>ViVa! Vienna!</u>, which is celebrating its 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year. In addition to providing a weekend of rides, entertainment, and food tastings, *Viva!Vienna!* generates substantial funds. Last year, the Club was able to donate \$180,000 to sponsored nonprofits and charities thanks to *Viva!Vienna!* The Club also helps to run a separate event, the **Brewfest**, on the same weekend, where a number of CHO members have volunteered.

The Club hosts a party for children facing financial challenges organized by Billy Thompson. Held in December, 137 persons attended last year. The party gives the children opportunities to create presents for their families, and to receive gifts from Santa. Finally, the Vienna Rotary sponsors the Jane Seeman Service Above Self Awards, which honor outstanding Town of Vienna staff and Vienna police and fire department personnel.

#### HELP FROM BALL PLAYERS OF ALL AGES

Springtime beckons with the thwack of softball and baseball bats. As we again "PLAY BALL," CHO wants to recognize help it has received from two sets of athletes.

Golden Girls: This year is the 35<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Golden Girls, a softball organization for senior women over age 40 with over 180 members. All skill levels are welcome. This Northern Virginia intramural league plays on Wednesdays and Saturdays, and has tournament teams that participate in national tournaments. Marilyn Mallery, the organization's membership chair, emphasized that the Golden Girls believe it important to contribute to the community to reflect the support they have received from the town of Vienna and others. CHO has been a consistent and grateful recipient of these collections for at least 20 years; there are usually 2 drives for CHO; one in spring and one during the holidays.
